

Adel, a desperate jobless father gets out on the streets of Beirut hoping for a change.





"Heroes" is a documentary that showcases the stories of Jad, Jana, Dana, and Gus; four Lebanese individuals who continue to push forward despite the ongoing political and economic turmoil in their country. Through their struggles, the documentary highlights the resilience and determination of all Lebanese people inspiring others to keep going despite insurmountable challenges of modern-day Lebanon.

In 2011, Leah decided to go to Lebanon to film with her grandmother. Two weeks after the shoot, her grandmother died of metastatic lung cancer. It took her 12 years to get the courage to revisit their last conversations. Through memories and poems she draws the portrait of her grandmother in homage to her unique character.



After a big battle with cancer, Carine has only one solution to save her life: organ transplant. In a country where everyone is born a donor, transplantation was a lifesaving answer. But if this French scenario was placed in a Lebanese setting, would Carine have had the chance to tell us her story?

"Doigts de fée" is a documentary that tells the journey of my son, who, despite his differences, was able to grow, face challenges, and fulfill himself. It portrays the son whom I accompanied, transitioning from a feeling of helplessness to pride and fascination.
